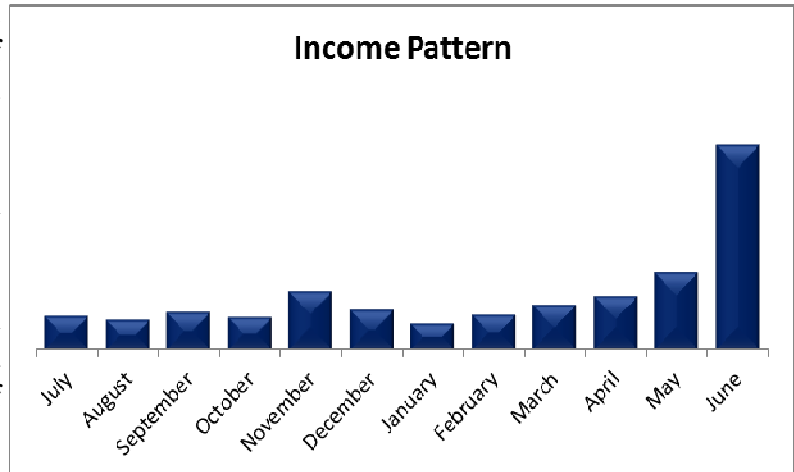

## PERSONAL AND CLUB GIVING

Over the course of the Rotary year the shape of our income and expenditure on programs is a very mixed picture, depending on Country and the events that take place. From an “income” point of view our monthly receipts moved from between 4% (January) and 30% (June) of the total whereas expenditure is constant dependent on Grant payments although DDF tends to be mostly in the first half of the Rotary year.

The first half of the Rotary year is driven by personal contributions and the end of the second half (weighted to Australia and New Zealand) is driven by Club Contributions. The graph to the right is total income across all four contribution segments. The shape changes according to the country group with the Philippines strongest in November due to Foundation Month. Rotarians in the Philippines and Indonesia are extremely supportive of giving in the month. In fact November is the biggest month of the year in that market. The weight of personal giving in Australia is starting to get traction in November.



It is interesting to note the following shape of participation and contribution:

As a Region there is strong growth against last years YTD with a 33% Annual Fund growth to December. This is an outstanding result given the falling value of the many currencies against the US\$. We will need to see strong growth in contributions in the second half of the year if the local currencies continue to fall.

There are a number of factors driving the growth. The Paul Harris Society and the steady movement of individuals achieving higher Major Donor Levels are a contributing factor. The attraction of Arch Klumph Society membership is also there. On this note it was pleasing to see the AKS grow in Australia from 8 to 9 members with the addition of the first AKS member from South Australia.

The Rotary Foundation is four star (highest possible) rated charity as rated by Charity Navigator. It is our charity and yet less than 50% of Rotarians across the region make a contribution. In Australia where we have data on charities, the average is a gift to three charities on a regular basis. All we would ask is that The Rotary Foundation be in that basket of three charities. We would more than triple of income if that were the case.

## THE PAUL HARRIS SOCIETY

As an official program of the Rotary Foundation since 1 July 2013, we have seen steady growth in participation. As the end of December we have 801 Paul Harris Society Members across the region. What it means for our Foundation is that nearly 10% of our current total fundraising comes from just 1.2% of our members. The pleasing thing to notice is that there is steady growth and may it continue. As you can see from the image on the right every quarter in the past calendar year has shown growth. The Districts that have been most successful are the ones

where there is an active and passionate Paul Harris Society chair. Of note is D9800 in Victoria, where PDG Gordon McKern is actively out speaking to Clubs on the great work that Paul Harris Society members help contribute to. There are now 90 members in that District and Gordon is aiming to have 100 PHS members by June.

The District also holds regular Paul Harris Society recognition Events where new Society members are recognized, Major Donors are recognized and there is a Foundation key note speaker. Districts that replicate this activity also share the same high level of participation and success. So the keys to success are:

- Passionate PHS Chairman
- Presentations to Clubs
- Identifying candidates with the help of the DRFC, EMGA and your Rotary Staff
- Recognition Events
- Annual reminder letters of due payments with the current exchange rate

It would be great to see 1200 members of the Society by June which is a 50% growth from the current number. This would take us to nearly 2% of all Rotarians on the Region.

## END POLIO NOW

While Australia and New Zealand are contributing strongly to the cause, across the Region we have slowed in our level of giving in the first half of this Rotary year. It is noticeable that where a District has an active Polio Plus chair there is a strong giving relationship. The leading District in the region YTD is D9500 in South Australia with giving of over \$50,000 .The next nearest District is D9685 with just over \$32,000.

In Australia in February there will be a movie night where all participating Clubs will go to see the same movie on the same night. The movie this year is “The Second Best Exotic Marigold Hotel” We have organized for a special Rotary video to be screened prior to the beginning of the movie. This should happen in the cinema’s where we know that the Rotary Club has booked the special screening for February 26, which is the global release date of this movie. Week commencing Feb 7 we will ask each DRFC in Australia for a list of participating theatres. It is expected that the event will generate over \$100,000 for the End Polio now Program.

## FINANCE MATTERS

### JANUARY 2015 CLUB INVOICE

Club invoices are currently being finalized based on membership information as at 1 January 2015. Please expect these to be sent electronically to officers' email addresses as registered in the Rotary International database by **26 January 2015**. Paper invoices will also be sent shortly after to secretaries of clubs who have not yet opted out of receiving them.

This invoice is no longer an estimate but based on the official membership number of Rotary Clubs. What is currently billed is what is owed and requires no further recalculation.

### JULY 2014 SEMI ANNUAL DUES COLLECTION

As of 16 January 2015, there are eighteen (18) clubs who have outstanding balances above USD250 for their July 2014 RI Dues: one each from Australia and New Zealand and 16 clubs in the Philippines are candidates for termination.

Reinstatement requirements for these candidates will be 1) payment of all outstanding balances, 2) reinstatement fee of USD10/member if reinstated by 31 March 2015, 3) Application to Reinstatement form with Recharter fees of USD15/member if reinstated by December 31, 2015, 4) updated membership lists.

### CHANGE IN COUNCIL ON LEGISLATION LEVY

The RI Board has approved a change in the cost of the Council on Legislation levy ("additional per capita dues") from US\$1.00 per Rotarian per year to US\$1.50 per Rotarian per year effective from 1 July 2015.
