RYLA emphasizes leadership, citizenship, and personal growth and aims to;


- Demonstrate Rotary's respect and concern for youth.

Young people (19 – 29) with:

- ~ Leadership experience or potential either in the workplace or in the community.
- ~ A desire to learn.
- ~ Participation in Community activities.

Participants will learn;

- Fundamentals of leadership
- Ethics of positive leadership
- Importance of communication skills in effective leadership
- Problem solving and conflict management
- What Rotary is and what it does for the community
- Building self-confidence and self-esteem
- Elements of community and global citizenship.
